School Uniform

Absences

If your child is going to be absent from school please let the school office know either by phone or email before 9.15am on the first day of absence.



PE Kit

Your child will be made aware of which days their classes have PE. It is most important that they have a change of clothing, including footwear, for these activities, available on the right days.

We ask that Infant children leave their PE kits in school.

In the interests of Health and Safety, children should not wear jewellery and long hair should be securely tied back.

Autumn Clubs / Activities

You will shortly be receiving details of our new programme of clubs and activities for the Autumn/Spring Term. I would remind you that this important enrichment to your children's lives in school is dependant upon the voluntary good-will of the staff involved. I thank them all on your behalf and trust that your children will enjoy these additional opportunities.



Safeguarding

The school has a legal duty to report any non-accidental injuries to children. Where children have had an injury from an accident outside school, we ask that parents please inform the school so that we respond appropriately. The school's Child Protection and Safeguarding Policy will involve links with police and/or social care as appropriate. It is therefore essential that parents inform the school of accidental injury to pupils whilst they are at home. The school cannot hesitate to report any instance of abuse. Thank you for your help with this.



School Lunches

A significant number of pupils at Woodfall are taking part in the Governments new scheme of providing all infant children with a free hot meal at lunchtime.

Can we please remind junior parents that:

- Lunch money should be paid in advance on a Monday morning. If you wish your child to take a meal on an ad hoc basis we suggest you send in £10.75 which will be credited to their account and would enable them to take a lunch on 5 occasions. Please avoid sending £2.15 in daily.
- Cheques would be the preferred method of payment and should be made payable to Cheshire West and Chester Council. If the name on the cheque is different from the child's name then please put the child's name on the back of the cheque.
- Cash or cheques sent into school
 must be in a sealed envelope clearly
 marked with your child's name and
 year group and the amount enclosed.
 If you require a supply of envelopes
 please ask at the school office.
- Families with more than one child in school can send in one cheque indicating on the envelope how the money is to be divided between each child's account.
- There is a 'posting box' inside the main entrance for all dinner money payments. Payments can be sent in with your child via the classroom; however, the posting box offers a higher degree of security particularly if you do send in cash. There will be no money left in this box overnight.



Juniors Playtime Healthy Snacks

Just a reminder that we expect all snacks children bring to school for their playtime break from Monday - Thursday to be healthy snacks: fruit is perfect (no sweets or crisps please) Toast will continue to be sold at playtime. On Fridays children may bring in crisps, should they wish to.

Many thanks for supporting us with this.

Please note that Infant children will continue to be provided with fruit daily from the National Fruit Scheme.



Water Bottles

We expect children to bring in water bottles so they can have access to drinking water throughout the day. Please note all research indicates that water is best for hydrating our brains: no fruit juice please.



Reading



Please ensure your child is reading every day (and at weekends and during the school holidays). Whilst reading skills are being taught at school, all the extra practice is vital for children to be successful readers.



Homework Club

We welcome children and parents together to attend our Homework Club which is open from 8.20am every Monday. Whilst you are very welcome to join your child every Monday, you may also use our Homework Club as a 'drop in' to receive guidance for specific homework. You may also wish your child (on his/her own) to attend homework club every Monday and should this be the case, please contact our school office for a permission slip.



Arrive on Time - Ready to Learn

We have noticed that a number of children continue to arrive late in the mornings. Late arrivals at school result in children missing the introduction to their first lesson, cause disruption to the rest of the class and can feel unsettled for the rest of the day. All children are expected to arrive in school ready for registration by 8.55am as lessons start promptly at 9.00am.

Can I please remind all parents that national regulations state: "Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time". The Department for Education requirement states "current law does not give any entitlement to parents to take their child on holiday during term time".
