## PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITY AND THE PROCEDURE FOR THE

**ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICINE** 

As is stated in the School Brochure it is LA policy that we do not administer medicines.

In exceptional circumstances: a long term medical problem or at the discretion of the Headteacher.

- 1. Parents will be asked to complete a 'Request for the school to administer medicine' official form clearly stating the medicine to be administered, dose, timing etc.
- 2. Medicine must be delivered to the school office by a parent/carer and will be returned to the adult at the end of the school day.
  - 3. Medicines will be kept in a locked cupboard or in the fridge in the staff room if they are to be kept cool. The key will be kept in a place that is out of the sight and knowledge of children in school.
- 4. School will not administer non-prescription medicine.
- 5. A record of the dose given and time given as well as the date and signature of person administering the medicine will be completed on the back of the medical form.
- 6. On school visits, the First Aider will be responsible for administering medication when children are off site.
- 7. Asthma inhalers and Epi-Pens will be kept in the child's classroom for emergency use.
