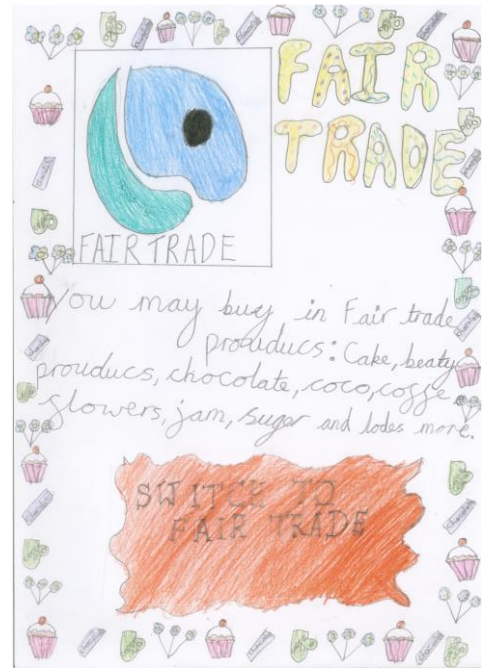


Creating a soundtrack to depict different moments from 'Changa and The Chocolate factory,' a story about child slavery.

WALT: To sequence the journey of tea from field to cup

Planting	Picking	Weighing
		
First job is to plant tea bushes called 'caneola buranica'	Next, the tea is picked (Picked) then it is taken to a BLM truck	The BLM truck drives the Green leaves to a factory. They stay there for 20 hours.
Sorting	Drying/hopping	Tasting
		
When the tea powder is black and dry, it is sorted into big bits and small bits.	The chopped up leaves are then put into round driers. The second thing to happen is that the leaves are chopped into huge machines.	Finally a tea taster tastes a cup of tea and decides if it is ready.
